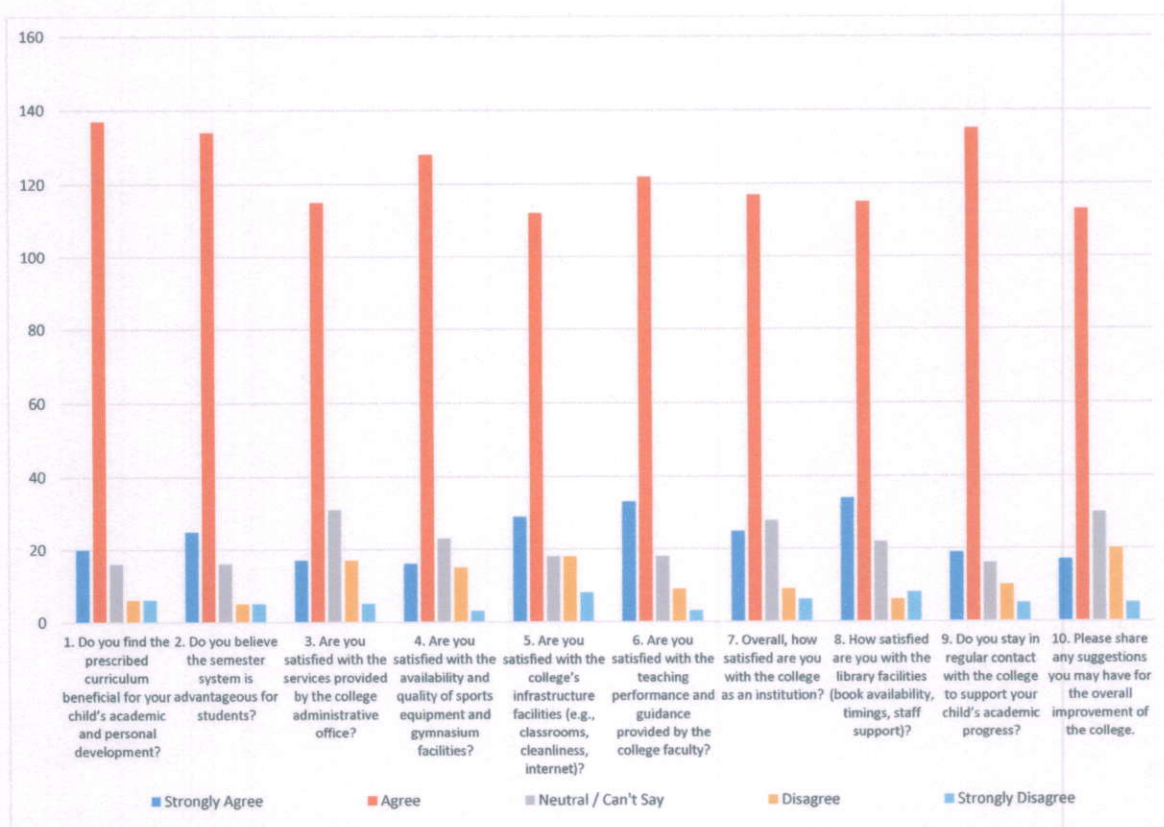
1. To evaluate the effectiveness of the curriculum in supporting students' academic and personal development.

PARENT FEEDBACK 2024-25 ANALYSIS

1. Do you find the prescribed curriculum beneficial for your child's academic and personal development?

The feedback indicates that the majority of parents are satisfied with the curriculum. Around 85% of parents either strongly agreed or agreed that the curriculum is beneficial for their child's academic and personal growth. A small percentage, about 6%, expressed disagreement, and a few remained neutral. This suggests that the curriculum is well-structured and meets the expectations of most parents.

2. Do you believe the semester system is advantageous for students?

A strong majority of parents (approximately 86%) believe that the semester system is beneficial for students. Only about 5% disagreed with this view, and a few parents were neutral. This reflects a positive perception towards the semester-based academic structure, indicating that parents find it supportive of their children's learning pace and assessment.

3. Are you satisfied with the services provided by the college administrative office?

Around 71% of parents expressed satisfaction with the college's administrative services. However, a notable portion, about 12%, disagreed, and approximately 17% were neutral. This mixed feedback points to a generally acceptable level of service but also highlights a need for improvement in administrative efficiency and communication.

4. Are you satisfied with the availability and quality of sports equipment and gymnasium facilities?

About 78% of the parents were satisfied with the availability and quality of sports equipment and gymnasium facilities. Around 9% showed dissatisfaction, while about 12% remained neutral. This suggests that while most parents appreciate the sports facilities, there is still scope for enhancing sports and fitness amenities for students.

5. Are you satisfied with the college's infrastructure facilities (e.g., classrooms, cleanliness, internet)?

Approximately 76% of parents expressed satisfaction with the college's infrastructure facilities. Around 14% disagreed and about 10% were neutral. This indicates that the majority of parents find the infrastructure adequate, but there are some concerns related to certain aspects like maintenance, cleanliness, or internet connectivity.

6. Are you satisfied with the teaching performance and guidance provided by the college faculty?

An impressive 84% of parents agreed or strongly agreed that the college faculty provides excellent teaching and guidance. Only about 6% disagreed, and a small number

remained neutral. This reflects a very strong endorsement of the teaching quality and faculty engagement with students.

7. Overall, how satisfied are you with the college as an institution?

Overall satisfaction with the college is high, with nearly 77% of parents responding positively. About 8% disagreed and around 15% remained neutral. While the majority are satisfied, a focus on continuous improvement could help further enhance the institution's reputation among parents.

8. How satisfied are you with the library facilities (book availability, timings, staff support)?

Feedback on the library facilities was also largely positive, with about 80% of parents expressing satisfaction. Around 8% were dissatisfied and nearly 12% remained neutral. This indicates that the library services are generally meeting the expectations of parents, though slight improvements could be beneficial.

9. Do you stay in regular contact with the college to support your child's academic progress?

A high level of parental engagement is evident, with about 83% of parents stating they maintain regular contact with the college regarding their child's academic progress. About 8% disagreed and another 9% were neutral, showing that while most parents are actively involved, efforts to encourage even greater communication could be useful.

FINDINGS OF THE PARENT FEEDBACK 2024-25

Findings Based on Parents' Feedback Analysis

1. High Satisfaction with Curriculum:

The majority of parents (around 85%) find the prescribed curriculum beneficial for their child's academic and personal development, indicating that the curriculum is well-designed and meets parental expectations.

2. Positive Acceptance of Semester System:

Most parents (around 86%) believe that the semester system is advantageous for students, suggesting that the structure is considered effective for managing learning and evaluations.

3. Moderate Satisfaction with Administrative Services:

While a good number of parents (about 71%) are satisfied with the college administrative office, a significant portion showed neutrality or dissatisfaction, highlighting an area that needs improvement in service delivery and communication.

4. Good Feedback on Sports and Gymnasium Facilities:

Approximately 78% of parents expressed satisfaction with sports equipment and gymnasium facilities, but the remaining responses indicate some scope for enhancing these physical development facilities.

5. Strong Satisfaction with Infrastructure:

Around 76% of parents are happy with the infrastructure, including classrooms, cleanliness, and internet facilities, though some concerns were noted that should be addressed to further strengthen the campus environment.

6. Excellent Feedback on Teaching and Faculty Guidance:

A very strong majority (around 84%) praised the teaching performance and mentoring by faculty members, reflecting high confidence in the academic support provided by the college.

7. Overall Institutional Satisfaction is High:

Approximately 77% of parents are satisfied with the college as a whole, though a moderate proportion of neutral or dissatisfied responses indicates opportunities for continuous institutional improvement.

8. Library Facilities Well-Appreciated:

Around 80% of parents expressed satisfaction with the library's resources, timings, and staff, although minor areas for enhancement were observed based on the neutral and dissatisfied responses.

9. Strong Parental Engagement:

The feedback shows that about 83% of parents stay in regular contact with the college to support their child's academic journey, demonstrating active parental involvement, which is crucial for student success.

SUGGESTIONS ON THE BASIS OF PARENT FEEDBACK 2024-25

1. Enhance Administrative Services:

Steps should be taken to make the college administrative office more efficient and parent-friendly. Regular training for administrative staff, a feedback system for services, and faster response to queries can significantly improve parents' experience.

2. Upgrade Sports and Gymnasium Facilities:

While the feedback is largely positive, there is room for improvement in sports infrastructure. Upgrading sports equipment, maintaining the gymnasium regularly, and organizing more sports activities can encourage greater participation and satisfaction.

3. Strengthen Infrastructure Maintenance:

Although most parents are happy with the infrastructure, specific issues like internet connectivity, classroom maintenance, and campus cleanliness need constant monitoring and periodic upgrades to maintain high standards.

4. Improve Communication Channels:

A few parents indicated irregular contact with the college. Establishing more structured communication channels—like periodic parent meetings, academic progress reports, and digital updates—can ensure better parental involvement.

5. Expand Library Resources and Services:

While the library is appreciated, efforts should be made to enrich the collection of books, extend library working hours during exams, and organize orientation sessions about library services for new students and parents.

6. Continuous Faculty Development:

Since parents are highly satisfied with the faculty, the college should continue investing in faculty development programs such as training workshops, research incentives, and updated teaching methods to maintain and further enhance teaching quality.

7. Organize Parent Interaction Programs:

Hosting regular parent-teacher meetings, open days, and feedback sessions can build stronger relationships and help parents feel more involved in the college community.

CONCLUSION ON THE PARENT FEEDBACK 2024-25

The analysis of the parents' feedback reveals a highly positive overall perception of the college's curriculum, teaching quality, and student support systems. Most parents express strong satisfaction with the academic structure, particularly the effectiveness of the prescribed curriculum and the semester system. High levels of appreciation for the faculty's teaching and guidance highlight the institution's commitment to academic excellence.

Parents also show considerable satisfaction with the infrastructure, sports facilities, library services, and overall institutional performance. However, the feedback also points to a few areas needing attention, such as administrative services, the enhancement of sports and gymnasium facilities, better communication with parents, and continuous upgrading of infrastructure.
